

GENERAL ABSTRACT RULES

All authors are invited to submit an abstract written by the following rules:

- Please download and use the '[Abstract Blank Form](#)' in which to write your abstract in, depending on the type of paper you will be writing (Review or Scientific)
 1. The whole text of the abstract has to be in Arial font - 10.
 2. A concise summary of the article clearly describing: content, significance, objectives, a brief methodology, findings and conclusions, preferably without references or abbreviations, should be provided.
 3. Abstract margins should be 2 cm, top, bottom, left, right for A4 format paper (see 'Abstract Blank Form').
 4. The submitted abstract should contain no more than 2000 characters (300 words) including: spaces (Tools – Word count), paper title, author names, addresses and key words.
- *All abstracts will be carefully reviewed by International **Editorial Board**. Once completed, the abstract should be submitted to the publisher via the 'Submit Abstract' button, located at the base of the tab 'Authors Guidelines', sub-tab 'Abstract Submission'.*

Definitions:

ORIGINAL SCIENTIFIC ABSTRACT - report unpublished results of completed original scientific research by the study's author(s). Experimental data should be presented in a way that enables reproduction and verification of analyses and deductions on which the conclusions are based.

REVIEW ABSTRACT - synthesizes, summarizes, analyzes and evaluates published works on a specific topic. They are critical surveys of an area in which preferably the author himself is active. By organizing, integrating and evaluating previously published material, the author of a review article considers the progress of a current research towards clarifying a problem. Review articles range from entirely descriptive to highly evaluative.
