Brief introduction

- Explain <u>why this is an interesting or important question/s (research)?</u> Keep it brief. Grab the reader's interest while introducing the topic. Explain the "big picture" relevance. Provide the necessary background information. What was the <u>aim of the review?</u>

Body of the abstract

- <u>Describe important results from recent/previous</u> primary literature articles. Explain how those results shape the current understanding of the topic.
- Mention the types of experiments done and their corresponding data (by you or other authors) if applicable, but do not repeat the experimental procedure step by step.
- Point out and address any controversies in the field.
- Give your opinion for each issue (a must).

Conclusions

- Summarize your major points succinctly.
- Point out the significance of your opinion.
- <u>Discuss the open questions that remain in the area and future directions.</u>
- Keep it brief.

Key words

- From 3 to 8 words or phrases.
